3. Sharon Childs (Item 7) **Band stand event president- made to rent out, not sure if it went out to bid? .. she agreed it was a high price .. raised \$69,000 11 years ago for the \$75,000 project.. mentioned “Benches” for sale...**

2. Jeff Suzuki. - **Spoke on “ICE” Shooting .. backed up by members in Video holding signs behind him.. Demanding action by council. Request a law be made for public safety. (On-going issue) Mention DEI Commission..**
3. Sue Ann Lorig **“echo what Jeff said”... 12 year resident .. back up by video (smaller window - 1 & 1/2 signs visible)**
4. Keith Blaine - **26 yrs ago last spoke ... request amendment for radio dog collar “fences in hillside” property owners. Obviously a dog owner!**
5. Susan Bassi - **former publisher - highly trained investigator reporter - 6 yrs ago started - “Cost of Speech”... said probably one of the worst town in entire state .. about public records handling.. 4 police officers are paid over \$150k up to 250k .. blah, blah, blah .. ? Targeting protesters? ... says spending money “right & left” and no records... ends with lawsuit talk and to cut police funds who go after protests.**
